Proposed By-Law Change

Discussion of By law Article 12 section 3 BUDGET AND RESERVE Subsection C concerning budget reserve. change A. LICA must prepare and maintain an annual budget approved by the Board. (added from long term planning)

Motion by Wayne Litwiller to have the following changes: delete B & C Add LICA must maintain a two hundred thousand (\$200,000) amount in reserve. Any withdraws from reserves shall be replaced by using five percent (5%) of each years dues income until reserves are returned to the two hundred thousand amount.

Motion by Norm Kocher to approve by law change, seconded by David Rule.

News & Notes

North Dakota LICA Holds Members Meeting Sponsored by the ND Corn Growers.

The first meeting of the newly formed North Dakota LICA state chapter was sponsored by the North Dakota Corn Growers at the Fargodome during the 2013 Northern AG Expo. Jerry Biuso National LICA CEO and Region Vice President Brad McArdle attended the meeting and reviewed the many benefits available to the LICA members. Derrik Ellingson, Ellingson Drainage was selected the first state president and Mike O'Neil, Prinsco was appointed to the Board of Directors. Abbey Wick, Ph.D. Assistant Professor of Soil Health-Extension/Department of Soil Science, North Dakota State University discussed the Share Farm in Mooreton, ND.

Establishment of the NDSU Soil Health & Agriculture Research Extension (SHARE) Farm.



The Soil Health and Agriculture Research Extension (SHARE) Farm in Mooreton, ND is a location where North Dakota State University (NDSU) Research and Extension faculty are answering important questions producers have related to soil health and whole-system management. This project, funded by the ND Corn

Council, is a direct voice for farmers where they drive the "soil health building" management practices being tested using full-size equipment and field-scale plots. The SHARE Farm also provides the platform to transfer information directly from multiple research projects on soil health to producers. This is done through NDSU Extension Service using multiple formats such as web-based resources, short videos, small-scale producer education groups, and large-scale field days and workshops. On the flip side, NDSU Research and Extension faculty benefit from producer feedback and their direct involvement in the work being conducted at this site leading to the development of relevant, timely information for North Dakota producers.

Layers of information are critical to the understanding and advancement of management approaches for improving soil health in agricultural systems. This past summer, NDSU has already completed thousands of hours of work at the SHARE Farm and accomplished the following research tasks: elevation and salinity mapping development of interpretive maps, grid soil sampling and analyses, well installation and monitoring (15 wells), weed and disease surveys.

Extension programming and project promotion were integrated into the SHARE Farm program in 2013. They held the first annual Saline and Sodic Soil Field Day, which centered on the SHARE Farm with 220 attendees for a full day tour. They have also developed promotional and educational videos for the project, which can be viewed by searching "NDSU Soil Health".
