Members of the NJLICA; Jerry Biuso, Bill Esposito, Tom Ervey, Peter Rochelle and John Rothberg with contributions from Stan SeEVERS, and Wayne Maresh won this "Special One of a Kind Cap" for only \$700.

The Cap, is designated to be perpetually auctioned at the NJLICA Holiday dinner each year.

LICA To Give Away Five Wooden Scale Models of Construction Equipment

LICA will be making its debut exhibition at the CONEXPO-CON/AGG this year. Members from all over the country will be meeting at the LICA Convention and attending the CONEXPO-CON/AGG. Each day of the five-day Expo, a different beautiful wooden scale model will be given away to one of the attendees visiting the LICA Booth #C-4351 in the Central Hall 1.

The five pieces LICA will be giving away are the Dump Truck, High Track, Track Hoe, Rubber Tire Backhoe and LowBoy.

These models are made from actual blueprints and are hand constructed from a variety of woods collected from many sources, including: maple, walnut from Kentucky, pine, poplar from North Carolina, walnut, cedar from Indiana and cypress. In order to have each one unique, only a clear finish is used to bring out the beautiful wood grain patterns and colors. The High Track has over three hundred pieces, as each pad on the track contains five pieces. After assembly, each model is sanded and finished a minimum of three times.

Glenn Myers (equipment operator for 37 years) and Frank Schwerphosser have been friends for 30 years. As both are retired, they share in the day-to-day responsibilities of producing and distributing their models. Frank cuts out the pieces and Glenn assembles, finishes and sells.

Harry Dibble of NYLICA introduced their models to LICA at the National Niagara Falls Summer Meeting in July, 2003. Harry did backhoe work for Glenn Myers in his hometown in New York for many years.

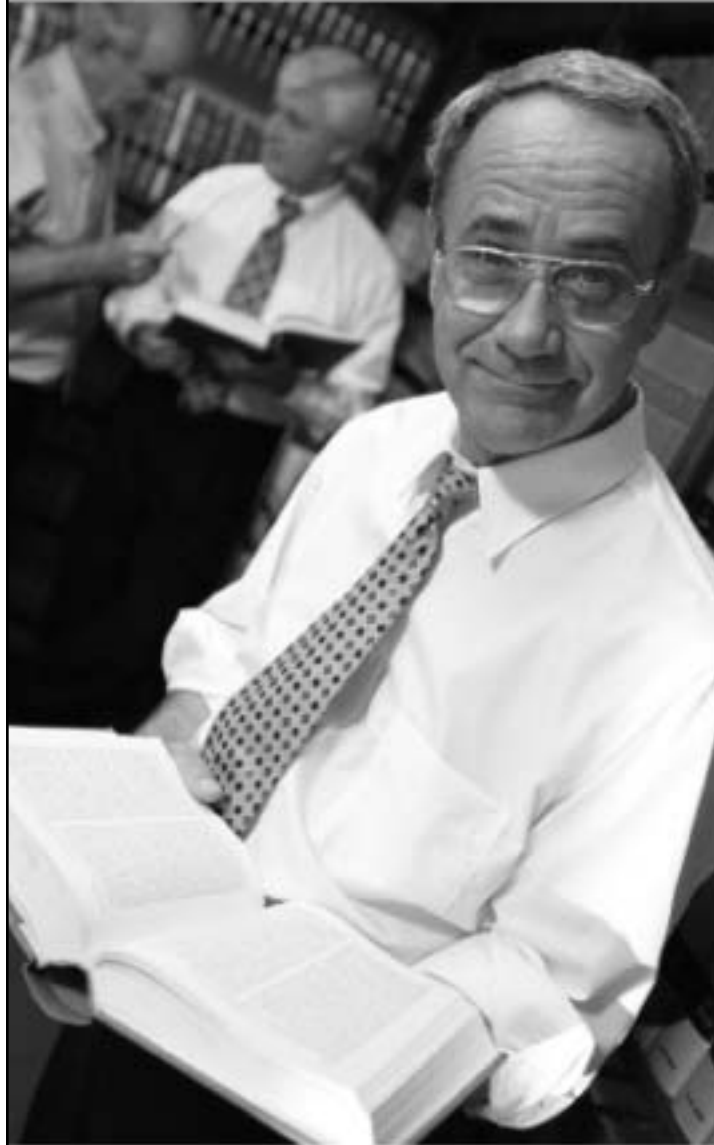

Identity Theft III

This is the third article I have written on identity theft. However, as criminals become more and more adept at stealing people's identity, we have to keep updating the information we publish on the subject.

In addition to stealing your wallet and stealing your mail, thieves will send a change of address to the Post Office forwarding your mail to another address, get your credit report posing as someone who would have a right to ask, etc.

I want to deal here with things you can do to defend against someone stealing your identity and emptying your bank account with it.

- How many cards and other items containing your ID do you carry in your wallet? Reduce these to those you use the most and your drivers license. If you must remove them from your person at work or at other exposed places, store them in a secure place. Never have your social security number printed on your check. (That goes for your drivers license number, too).
- Pick up your mail from your mailbox regularly. If you are going to be away for a day or so, have the Post Office hold your mail or have a friend pick it up for you. If the amount of mail you regularly receive suddenly drops off, ask the postman about it. If you are suspicious, check with the companies to which you make payments to see if something has gone amiss. Your mail may have been forwarded to a new address. Check your bank statements promptly and thoroughly for any discrepancies. Get a copy of your credit report regularly to see if any strange things have occurred.
- Burn or shred all papers that contain personal information. Don't just assume that things thrown into the trash won't be stolen. Look how many reporters rummage through trash cans and bins to get the "goods" on someone for an investigative story they are working on.
- Identity thieves have similar motives. Never give out social security numbers or credit card numbers over the phone or the internet unless you initiated the transaction or you are certain of the reputation of the other party. Ask businesses you deal with how they protect your personal information. If shopping on-line, be sure you are dealing with a business you know and trust or where you see a padlock icon or the URL contains "http."
- Never allow yourself to be "shadowed" or watched when making a withdrawal from an ATM or when accessing your account over the phone or internet. Don't write your PIN number down anywhere.

Tech Corner

One Fix for a Pond That Leaks

The good LICA members that went to Rapid City, SD in July to the summer convention toured a bentonite mine. We learned that bentonite is a clay of 1000 uses and one of those is stopping leaks in ponds.

Bentonite Clay can swell as much as 18 times its dry size once wet and is safe for fish. It is especially well-suited for sandy and coarse soils. There are three common methods of application.

First, blanket application is the most successful. Drain the pond and remove any trash and vegetation. Remove four to six inches of soil, then add a layer of bentonite and replace the soil that was removed. The bottom of the pond should be compacted and then refilled without causing any erosion.

Next, is the mixed blanket method in which you disk or till the bottom, spread bentonite on top, till it into the existing soil, and then compact it.

The third method is the sprinkle method. Only use this method if you can't drain the pond or if the leak has been found and is isolated. This method is the least successful.

HOOVER DAM DISCOVERY TOUR

An engineering wonder and one of the world's largest man-made lakes, Hoover Dam holds the Colorado River to form Lake Mead. This tour will take you to Hoover Dam where you have access to the exhibits, movie, and power plant located 500 feet below the dam's top. 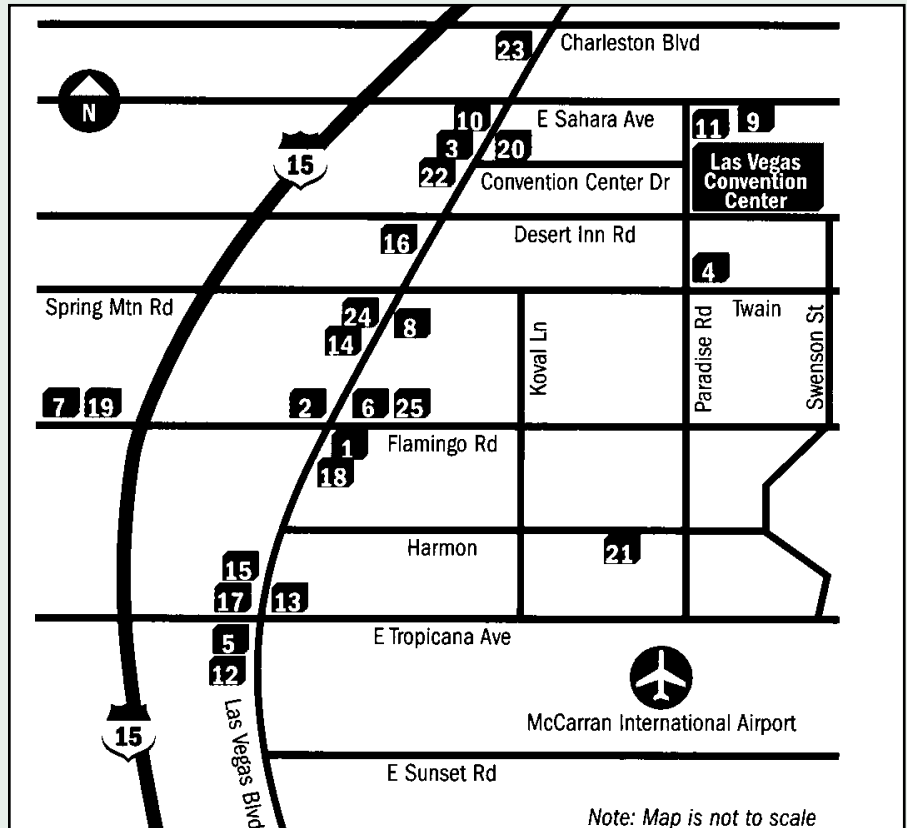
